Visit Mt. Rainier National Park – we're open for winter!

While areas of the park close during the winter, many areas remain open for winter fun. And fun you'll have this winter. From skiing, tubing and snowshoeing, to hiking, wildlife viewing and gondola rides, there are many winter adventures waiting for you. Whether you visit the park itself or the surrounding areas, you'll find a lot of fun activities to enjoy this season – some of them blanketed in winter's magical white powder.





Go Wildlife Watching at Northwest Trek

Bison and wolves and bears, oh my. While a visit to Mt. Rainier may not always present you with an opportunity to see wildlife in their natural habitat, Northwest Trek Wildlife Park is a sure thing. This massive 725-acre wildlife park tucked away in the forest near Mt. Rainier is the best (and safest) way to see over 200 North American animals from 30 different species, including owls, beavers, bobcats, cougars, lynx, elk, bears and beyond. Whether you take a leisurely walk through the trails or hop on the popular 45-minute tram tour, this is an experience you and your kids will not soon forget.

Experience Kids' Trek—NEW at Northwest Trek

Families are such a big part of Northwest Trek that they built Kids' Trek—one of the largest outdoor playgrounds in the state, just for kids and their imaginations. This new, nature-inspired playground encourages kids to learn about the natural world while releasing some of their boundless energy. 


Go skiing or boarding at Crystal Mountain or backcountry.

Trail of the Shadows

Easy 0.8 mile loop in Longmire: Perfect for beginners with little legs.

Cougar Rock

Easy 4.0 miles round trip in Longmire: Breathtaking views!

Reflection Lakes

Moderate 4.0 miles round trip in Paradise: Hike to a magical meadow of frozen lakes.

Huckleberry Creek

Easy 4.0 miles round trip in the Mt Baker-Snoqualmie Forest: Perfect for kids. Dogs welcome, too.

River Trail (Blue Diamond Trail)

Easy 3.2 miles round trip in the Mt Baker-Snoqualmie Forest: Beautiful trek with impressive trees. Dogs welcome.

Snowshoe the Mount Tahoma Trails Association's Trail System.

The Mount Tahoma Trails Association operates and manages the largest no-fee Hut-to-Hut Trail System in North America for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Approximately 50 miles of trails, 20 miles of which are groomed, provide safe and easy access to 3 ski huts and a yurt. Trails vary from novice to expert, are well signed and are patrolled by an all-volunteer ski patrol. Enjoy the trek for a day or overnight destination in the Ashford area. The trail system is accessed by two Washington State Sno-Parks and although plowed regularly, snow tires and chains may be needed to access the trailheads. Visitors with dogs are welcome on the South District MTTA Trails which grant access to High Hut, Bruni's Snow Bowl Hut and Yurt Side, but dogs aren't allowed in the warming huts, mudrooms, or vestibules. It can be bitter cold at night so visitors may want to consider leaving their dog with a friend at one of the dog-friendly lodging properties in Ashford, or at a kennel. Cross-Country skiing is an invigorating way to explore nature in the winter. Part workout, part fun, this winter activity is popular for good reason. You'll find multiple opportunities to cross-country ski in the Rainier area. Here are a few of our favorites:

Mount Tahoma Trails Association

The Mount Tahoma Trails Association operates and manages the largest no-fee Hut-to-Hut Trail System in North America for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Approximately 50 miles of trails, 20 miles of which are groomed, provide safe and easy access to 3 ski huts and a yurt. Trails vary from novice to expert, are well signed and are patrolled by an all-volunteer ski patrol. Enjoy the trek for a day or overnight destination in the Ashford area. The trail system is accessed by two Washington State Sno-Parks and although plowed regularly, snow tires and chains may be needed to access the trailheads. 


