Geocaching is a real-world, outdoor treasure hunt using GPS-enabled devices.

Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache (container) hidden at that location.

GET STARTED ON YOUR GEOCACHING QUEST!

- Read the Guidelines. You can download them at VisitRainier.com/geotour.
- Find the 25 caches in this series and record their code words in this passport.
- Some caches are earthcaches, which have no physical container but require you to answer questions to claim a find. When you email correct responses to the cache owner, they will give you the code word.
- Once you've completed this passport, you can receive a pathtag prize by filling out the form on the other side and mailing it to the listed address.
- We suggest you keep a copy of the completed passport in case it gets lost.
- Be sure to log your finds on the cache pages at geocaching.com so we can read about your adventures!

PRIZES: This GeoTour has four series, which are being released during 2015-16. Each 25-cache series has its own unique pathtag prize. Those who complete the entire GeoTour (100 caches) and submit all four passports are eligible for a commemorative geocoin.

- Series pathtags and geocoins are limited to one per family/household.
- Prizes will be awarded in the order that passports are received, while supplies last. (Don't worry, we minted 500 pathtags for Series 1, with similar numbers for later series.)
- Visit Rainier is not responsible for lost passports.
